The Food and Clothing Bank, located at 1050 N. State St., Freeburg, offers three different types of help for needy families living in the Freeburg High School District (Freeburg, Smithton, Floraville, Paderborn, St. Libory, and Fayetteville).


We offer Food Pantries at 1050 N. State St., Freeburg on the **first Tuesday (2:00-4:00 p.m.)**, **second Tuesday (2:00-4:00 p.m.)** and the **third Thursday (5:00-7:00 p.m.)** of each month. We use income guidelines for the Pantries (copy enclosed). Guidelines are also posted on the door of the building.

We provide emergency food orders (for emergency situations only) to needy families. Anyone in need should call one of our contact people at **539-5744, 539-5427, or 539-3306**. There are no income guidelines for this help. The decision to help is based on the situation of the family at the time.

We collect donations of good used clothing, shoes, and linens throughout the year. These items may be put into the clothing drop box located in front of the building at any time. Clothing is available to any needy family free of charge and available to pantry recipients at each pantry. We also hold a monthly clothing sale on the fourth Friday of each month from 9:00-11:00 a.m. which is open to the public.

We hope that you will call **539-5744, 539-5427, or 539-3306** to let one of our contact people know of any family in need. We appreciate your cooperation.

PANTRY REQUIREMENTS

Food and Clothing Bank holds a monthly Food Pantry on the 1st and 2nd Tuesday from 2:00-4:00 p.m. and the 3rd Thursday from 5:00-7:00 p.m. at the Food and Clothing Bank Building, 1050 N. State, Freeburg. To be eligible an applicant must:

1. Live in the Freeburg High School District (Freeburg, Smithton, Fayetteville, St. Libory, Floraville, or Paderborn)
2. Apply in person (eligible for help once a month)
3. Bring proof of residency (electric or telephone bill, medical card)
4. Bring proof of income for each person living in the household (pay stubs, food stamp stubs, etc.)
5. Be within these income guidelines:
