Petitions/Communications

There were two Freedom of Information Act requests. The first was from Janine Asmus who sought the names of any certified school librarians. The second was from Amber Lonsdale who sought any communications from the state regarding testing administered by the district. Both requests were filled within the five-day timeframe.

Public Participation

The Board welcomed the public to the meeting.

Teacher Ashley Krakosky addressed the Board. She is the Math Response to Intervention teacher for students in grades third – eighth. She stated the fall benchmarking is complete, and teachers are in the process of reviewing the data. She will collaborate with the teachers to establish the groups. She stated she really likes the established time to see her students without them missing instruction.

Teacher Jennifer Scheuchner addressed the Board. She is the Reading Response to Intervention teacher for students in grades third – eighth. She reviewed what she is working on with her students.

Reading Specialist Michelle Freebairn addressed the Board. She is the Reading Specialist at the Primary Center. She and the Paraprofessional Valerie Dean work with many students one-on-one. They just completed their testing to identify those students with the most need to emphasize the basic reading skills.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Brink stated the word of the month in October will be "Responsibility."

She distributed a copy of the resolutions up for a vote this November at the Triple I Conference in Chicago. Board Member Scheibel is the Board's delegate to vote. She reminded the board members to let him know if there are resolutions they feel strongly about.

Dr. Brink stated the district's current enrollment stands at 778 students.

Mr. Janssen presented the salary compensation report. This report must be presented to the Board of Education each year and then posted on the district website by October 1.

Mrs. Fark presented the Principal's Report for the Primary Center. On September 1, the district hosted two presenters from BASSC to give a conference on "Restorative Practices." The district held its intruder drill on September 12. On September 15, grades kindergarten – fifth hosted "Games with Grownups" where parents and grandparents were invited to the schools to play games with their children. The Primary Center held its Barn Dance on that same day, as well. On September 22, the district had an apple nacho bar for the staff. Mrs. Fark thanked Braeutigam's Orchard for donating the apples. The week of October 10 is fire prevention week for the Primary Center. Many activities are planned in cooperation with the Freeburg Fire Department.

Mrs. Zurliene presented the Principal's Report for the Elementary School. On September 1, the Middle School Science teachers had a professional development session on the new curriculum.

On September 18, a fire drill was held district-wide with consultation with the Freeburg Fire Department. The baseball and softball teams wrapped up their seasons last week. Both "A" teams finished with 11 wins. The eleven wins for the softball team was a school record. The cross-country season wraps up this week. The annual Fall Fest is scheduled for October 13.
